

## **Speeding in the Plantation**

A few complaints have been received recently about automobiles exceeding the posted 25 mph speed limit within Pawleys Plantation. Since the Speed Monitor was placed on Pawleys Plantation Way last year, the majority of our residents and guests have been traveling at the posted limit. However, there are still some people who exceed the speed limit by a considerable amount on a few of our other major roads—particularly Golden Bear Drive and Savannah Drive.

To reduce the potential for accidents—and particularly personal injury to our many walkers, runners, and joggers—the POA Board approved the placement of a new, moveable speed monitor on selected roads.

## **Potential Amendments to the By-Laws and Covenants & Restrictions**

The POA Board has drafted possible revisions to the POA By-Laws and the Covenants and Restrictions. The Board's proposed revisions are contained in two documents on the Legal Docs tab of this website. A hard copy of each document can also be checked out by Members for a five-day period at the Guard House. A link to a summary of the major proposed changes to each of the documents is contained on the right-hand column of each page of this website.

The Board discussed the proposed amendments at a POA Member Town Meeting on Saturday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, and suggestions were made for additional modifications. The Board is now in the process of reviewing those suggestions for possible inclusion in the amendments, and a vote of the Members via mail is planned for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter, and it is anticipated that the results of the vote will be announced at the Annual Meeting in February 2009.

Most of the revisions in the amendments relate to correcting inconsistencies and unclear terminology. However, some substantive revisions have also been made.
